Potential Supply Chain Delays

Many are aware by now of the Novel-Corona Virus that is greatly affecting both China and the rest of the world. An impressive united effort is taking place to help China and other regions return to what can be considered normalcy. With that, certain cautionary methods must still be taken to control exposure and prevent the spread of the virus.

Towards the end of the Chinese New Year Holiday, the Chinese government provided notice that businesses including offices and factories in specific areas of China were to remain closed through February 9th, effectively extending the holiday. We have since learned that additional notices have been released advising businesses of specific guidelines on resuming operations depending on city and worker status. Some business have been permitted to reopen with limited staff, employees that have traveled outside of their local government while on holiday will remain in quarantine for 14 days under the government's supervision, and certain areas have restricted businesses from opening until after March 1, 2020.

Due to the uncertain nature of the economic climate at present, potential supply chain delays may occur in the near future. International commerce as a whole will be presented with challenges for a period of time. Despite these known difficulties, the priority remains in fighting the virus to limit the spread and maintain the health of populations around the world.
